



## WASHINGTON NATIONALS YOUTH BASEBALL ACADEMY

### PHASE 2- Community Partner Guidelines

- ✓ Cohorts of athletes/coaches must be 12 or less. Please see spectator policy for GAMES only. Practices remain just for athletes and coaches.
- ✓ There may be no more than 250 people in the facility at one particular time.
- ✓ Games are permitted to be played for all low-contact sports. All social distancing measures are required to be followed during the game.
- ✓ All-Star Pavilion can have no more than 12 people in the pavilion at a time.
- ✓ ENTER/EXIT must be made from the parking lot off of Ely Place. IN/OUT arrows will be displayed on the sidewalks to adhere to proper social distancing protocols while entering and exiting the facility.
- ✓ Community partner's staff are required to perform a temperature check and a screening for COVID-19 symptoms for each athlete/coach prior to admission to the field
- ✓ Please adhere to CDC recommended guidelines for social distancing and proper hygiene. Posters will be placed throughout the facility detailing these guidelines.
- ✓ Facemasks are required for athletes/coaches upon arrivals, during water breaks, during idle times and while leaving the facility. The only time an athlete/coach does not have to wear a mask is while performing a vigorous physical activity
- ✓ All indoor activities must be limited to 10 people max (including coaches)
- ✓ High fives, handshakes, team huddles and any other form of physical contact is prohibited during the event.

- ✓ Belongings should be placed socially distant (at least 6ft) along the fence line of the field. This is where athletes and coaches should go for a rest and water break.
- ✓ Dugouts are open but masks must be worn while inside them. Social distancing should still be in effect. If necessary, use the bullpens or outsides of the fences (Field 2/3) and the bullpens or bleachers for Field 1.
- ✓ Bathrooms will be open. Please remember to wash your hands before exiting and returning to the facility.
- ✓ Hand sanitizer is located right inside the fence of each dugout. Please encourage everyone to use the hand sanitizer frequently during any event.
- ✓ Athletes should bring their own bats, gloves, helmets and any other equipment. Nationals Academy equipment is off-limits for Community Partner use.
- ✓ Please bring a prefilled water bottle or drink before practice begins. Water fountains will be turned off.
- ✓ Portable bleachers and the observation deck will be blocked off and are off-limits for use.
- ✓ Coaches will sanitize all shared equipment after each practice.
- ✓ Community Partners must adhere to all other DC and CDC COVID-19 guidelines.
- ✓ If you experience symptoms or are diagnosed with COVID-19 prior to arriving at the facility, stay home.
